Bridging Gaps, Breaking Cycles: Using Evidence-Based Practices and Community Organizing to Prevent Alcohol Related Harms

As the executive director for the Miami Gardens Substance Abuse Coalition, Mr. Chuck Ridley has spent over 30 years as a community organizer focusing on youth-oriented and grassroots programs. Mr. Ridley believes that creating sustainable, informed policy and infrastructure for marginalized communities is a key to uplifting neighborhoods burdened with alcohol and drug-related harms.
